

The Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) is developing the regulatory framework for Power of Choice metering reforms.

EPSDD is considering:

- Electrical licensing
  - o Licensing requirements for metering work covered by the reforms\*.
  - o Technical eligibility requirements for undertaking metering work^.
  - Potential recognition of:
    - NSW Level 2 ASP accreditation
    - Other relevant competencies and experience in metering work
  - \* Reforms generally relate to installation of Type 4 advanced meters.

^ A licence will not authorise network access - additional network safety training would be required for this. Licensees would also need to be recognised as a metering provider by a metering coordinator to undertake relevant metering work.

- Training
  - Availability of training in metering competencies in the ACT region.
- Codes of practice and certification
  - Certificate of electricity safety and inspection requirements for metering work both associated with new electrical installations and replacements/maintenance.
  - Code covering specific metering requirements, for example location of metering to allow access for maintenance.
- Communications

Explaining changes and opportunities associated with new metering arrangements for:

- Consumers/ electricity users
- o Electricians
- o Metering coordinators and electricity retailers
- o Developers, builders and construction contract solicitors
- Other property practitioners.

Consultation with industry and the community will be carried out in 2017.
